

TRAINING AND EDUCATION AWARD – INDIVIDUAL TEACHER AWARD CRITERIA



The Training and Education Award: Individual Teacher recognises and honours the outstanding achievements of a STEM or vocational education and training (VET) teacher. This encompasses teachers at TAFEs, independent RTOs and private companies. Entrants will be judged on criteria such as delivery of quality, innovative training programs, high level of skill, knowledge or craftsmanship, strong links with students, and dedication to their profession.

Please provide a brief biography of the teacher being nominated for the Award. This should include details of any training or qualifications, a summary of their professional experience, their key skills, and any major projects or achievements. It should also summarise why they deserve to win the award.

These photos will be used for promotional purposes, including but not limited to: PowerPoint presentations at event ceremonies, in Weld Australia's newsletters, EDMs, magazines, social media and website. By uploading photos, you confirm that you have the permission of all people photographed for their use in promotional purposes. Please note that the files must be either a JPEG or a PNG. The file must also be over 1MG in size, but the larger the better.

AWARD CRITERIA

Delivery of Quality, Innovative Training (300 words maximum)

Outline how the teacher delivers consistently high standards of teaching and learning, with a focus on quality and innovative. This may include factors like the use of advanced technology, cutting edge teaching methodologies, and innovative curriculum.

High Level of Skill, Knowledge or Craftsmanship (300 words maximum)

Outline how the teacher demonstrates a high level of skill, knowledge or craftsmanship in their day-to-day role.

Dedication to Their Profession (300 words maximum)

Outline how the teacher demonstrates dedication to their profession. This might include creating a positive culture, ongoing professional development to improve teaching and curriculum delivery, and academic achievements.

Strong Links with Students (300 words maximum)

Outline how the teacher fosters and maintains strong relationships with students.

Other Qualities and Pursuits (300 words maximum)

Please include any other information that may be relevant to the award, such as the welding professional's involvement in community activities, industry activities, and other awards and achievements.
