Craftsmanship and Innovation (500 words maximum)

Outline how the project demonstrates excellence in craftsmanship. Outline how the project was innovative in terms of design, fabrication or erection. Consider factors such as the use of automation, robotics, Industry 4.0 and the implementation of innovative techniques, processes and procedures.

Quality Assurance and Health & Safety (500 words maximum)

Outline how the project ensured quality, as well as health and safety performance. Consider factors such as qualifications and certifications, and policies and procedures.

Sustainability (500 words maximum)

Outline how sustainable principles were incorporated into the project. Consider factors such as impact on the surrounding environment, implementation of an environmental management policy, waste reduction, recycling, and investments in renewable energy, electric vehicles and sensor lighting.
