

WELDING PROFESSIONAL OF THE YEAR AWARD CRITERIA



This Award recognises professionals who are making a valuable contribution to the Australian welding and fabrication industry. The individual should demonstrate a high level of skill, knowledge or craftsmanship, be dedicated to their profession, and have professional development plans in place.

Welding Coordinator: To qualify for the Welding Coordinator of the Year Award, the individual will need to be assessed by Weld Australia as conforming to the requirements of AS/NZS ISO 14731 (ISO 14731) and continues to perform the role of welding coordinator. IIW International Welding Engineer (IWE), IIW International Welding Technologist (IWT) or an IIW International Welding Specialist (IWS) qualification is preferred.

Welding Supervisor: To qualify for the Welding Supervisor of the Year Award, the individual must at least hold either an AS 1796 Certificate 10, or an AS 2214 qualification (or equivalent or higher).

Welding Inspector: To qualify for the Welding Inspector of the Year Award, the individual must hold one of the following: an AS1796-11 qualification, an IIW International Welding Inspector - Basic (IWI-B), or an IIW International Welding Inspector - Standard (IWI-S) qualification.

Please note that evidence of this qualification (such as a certification of completion) may be required / requested. Weld Australia reserves the right to not make an award in any specific category where the nominated candidates do not meet the required criteria

This should include details of any training or qualifications, a summary of their professional experience, their key skills, and any major projects or achievements. It should also summarise why they deserve to win the award.

High Level of Skill, Knowledge or Craftsmanship (500 words maximum)

Outline how the welding professional demonstrates a high level of skill, knowledge or craftsmanship in their day-to-day role. This may include specific examples of projects or client work.

Dedication to Their Profession (500 words maximum)

Outline how the welding professional demonstrates dedication to their profession. This might include creating a positive company culture, being reliable, seeking feedback, meeting client deadlines, or volunteering to help.

Professional Development Plans (500 words maximum)

Outline the professional development plan and future aspirations that the welding professional has in place. This might include training that they are currently undertaking or future plans for training, as well as on-the-job learning.
